What is **SB** 1383?

- California's new organic waste and surplus food recovery law. It affects both businesses and households.
- SB 1383 makes feeding people, not landfills, law. Businesses with surplus edible food must now donate to food recovery organizations like Feeding San Diego.







Why It Matters: People

It's bananas! Hundreds of thousands of people are facing hunger in San Diego County while more than 35% of all food produced is wasted in the United States each year.

Rising sea levels Reduced snowpack Wildfires Drought **Heat Waves**

Why It Matters: Environment

Landfilled organic waste emits METHANE GAS – a super pollutant more powerful than $C0_2$.

Methane gas contributes to climate change which California is already experiencing.

Organic waste is the largest waste stream in California, including food waste which accounts for more than 6 million tons each year!

Commercial Edible Food Generators

Tier 1

January 1, 2022


Tier one businesses typically have more produce, fresh grocery, and shelf-stable foods to donate.



Tier 2

January 1, 2024

Tier two businesses typically have more prepared foods to donate, which often require more careful handling to meet food safety requirements (e.g. time and temperature controls).



with On-Site Food Facility

What does SB 1383 mean for you?

Starting January 1, 2024, Tier 2 food generators must:

- Donate the maximum amount of edible food rather than composting or wasting it
- Arrange for food recovery through a contract or written agreement with food recovery organizations (such as Feeding San Diego!)
- Maintain records of:
 - Each food recovery organization you work with
 - Contracts and agreements available for review
 - Types of food collected or self-hauled
 - o Established frequency of donations
 - o Pounds per month





How Can Feeding San Diego Support You?

- We will pick-up your food donations on a regular basis, or as needed
- Provide you with written agreements and reports for SB 1383 compliance
- We will ensure your surplus food gets into the hands of people in our community facing hunger

Food rescue partners recovered **over 13.4 million pounds** of the total 27.3 million pounds we diverted from the landfill last year

484 Food Donors with 776 recurring pick-ups every week!



108 Food Rescue Partners








Advantages of Working With Us

- The MealConnect posting process is automated, making things simple for donors
- Pickups can either be scheduled or requested in real time. A combo of the two works well for most donors!



Donation Requirements:

- All food donations should be cooled quickly if previously held hot and kept stored at 41°F or below.
- Cannot include any food that was previously reheated.
- Cannot include foods previously served to the public (i.e. exposed to the public on a self-service buffet or on bulk displays exposed to the public).
- Prepared food donations need to have an ingredient label. We can provide a template!





Case Study: The San Diego Zoo

- Since January 2020, our food rescue partners have recovered over 7,000 pounds of food from the San Diego Zoo
- The zoo donates prepared food such as rice, BBQ chicken, vegetable stir-fry, macaroni & cheese, hamburgers and more
- Some of the organizations that benefit are Alpha Project for the Homeless, Life Christian Center, Partnership for a Better San Diego, and San Diego Rescue Mission.
